RESEARCH PROFILE

1. As research assistant, from 1982-1983, I participated in stage III trials of the subcutaneous contraceptive pellet, which was eventually released commercially as a contraceptive implant. The contraceptive implant has empowered women in third world countries plan their pregnancies.
2. I was co-director of a study at St. Vincent's Hospital comparing the prevalence of psychiatric disorders among HIV patients who were psychiatrically referred in the ER and Walk-in Clinic in 1988 and 1996. In 1988, a greater percentage of white men who acquired HIV through homosexual transmission were evaluated. In 1996, there was a higher prevalence of women and minorities who became infected through IV drugs. The following decreased rates of change of DSM-IV diagnoses were noted in 1988 and 1996: delirium/dementia from 48% to 20% and adjustments/ anxiety disorder from 22% to 18%. The advent of antiretroviral medication may have played a role in the decreases.
3. I was project co-director with Iffath Hoskins MD at NYU Downtown, from 1998-2003, on the psychological and physical demands of pregnancy. Higher numbers of women in the "service clinic" (recent Chinese immigrants from lower socioeconomic backgrounds) reported stress in the first trimester. As the pregnancy progressed, the number of "service clinic" women reporting stress decreased, while the "private clinic" (professional women with higher socioeconomic background) reported high stress in the postpartum period. The Chinese immigrants may have a better "sense of coherence" and support within their families and community to cope with the demands of motherhood. Results were statically significant.

CLINICAL PROFILE

As a top psychiatrist in New York, as rated by the International Association of Healthcare Professionals and inclusion in “The Leading Physicians of the World”, I help patients transcend suffering and move towards self-expansion and healing. With medical training as a consultation/liaison psychiatrist and intellectual orientation as a psychoanalyst, my approach is empathic, individualized and holistic. As a Distinguished Fellow of the APA, I remain active within the community and serve on numerous boards, including Channel Thirteen/ WNET since 2003. Throughout my career, I remain dedicated to teaching psychiatric residents and other house staff, including supervising Mount Sinai Beth Israel fourth year psychiatric residents on long term psychotherapy cases, since 2013.

As a national and international trauma psychiatrist, I have worked with the homeless, emergency workers at Ground Zero, refugees of the Chechen genocide and in a medical clinic in the most remote region of Nepal with people without medical access. My humanitarian work at Ground Zero has been featured on the news, The Yomiuri Shimbun (Japan’s largest national newspaper), magazines and journals. The Grief Relief Network was co-created by me to help support families who lost loved ones from 9/11.

In addition to working with victims in the Chechen genocide, I emotionally supported three Chechen children as they obtained prosthetics and medical care in NY. My humanitarian work was featured in the Daily News and Chechen newspapers. My psychiatric article on my humanitarian experience has been nationally and internationally presented and awarded with a NYU Postdoctoral scholarship.

IMPACT

I have dedicated my life to help my patients transcend suffering and move towards healing. I am committed to psychiatric teaching of residents, humanitarian work with the traumatized and furthering my development through postdoctoral training in psychoanalysis. My psychiatric work at Ground Zero was particularly significant as emotional support was given to emergency workers and family members of victims during the actual trauma, as opposed to afterwards, which may have lessened resulting anxiety and depression. By appearing frequently on the local news after 9/11, I encouraged New Yorker’s to remain calm during 9/11, the postal office poisonings with anthrax and other perceived terrorist attacks. My television message was to mourn our loss, but then go on with their daily living. Through humanitarian work, both nationally and internationally, I have worked extensively with the marginalized to receive medical and psychiatric care to lessen their feeling of hopelessness and to not only heal, but flourish. In an attempt to deter the next generation of terrorists, I have shown the courage and passion by reaching out, nationally and internationally, to provide medical and emotional support and demonstrate that those in despair are not alone and that others care. My experiences taught me how inspiring it is to feel one can rise above unimaginable horror and find connection to something greater.
